The speaker talked about our "Expectations" in life; but then what really happens. I Corinthians 13:11 "When I was a child I spoke and thought and reasoned as a child. But when I became a woman my thoughts grew far beyond those of my childhood, and now I have put away my childish things." PASTOR'S PEN

WE SERVE A RISEN SAVIOR

It is surely no coincidence, but part of God's plan, that Easter comes in the spring. It is a beautiful time of year. People gain renewed strength and energy. Those who felt like doing nothing suddenly feel like getting outside and doing things. Spring comes upon us suddenly. It seems like we just get up one day and the trees are budded. All of a sudden, without previous notice, there are flowers sticking out of the ground that weren't there the day before. We use the term spring has *broken forth*. *Breaking forth* has an emerging connotation. It is without previous notice.

Imagine on that 1st Easter morning, very early in the morning and the sun is just ready to sneak thru. The stone is still in front of the tomb and God works the greatest miracle known to man, the raising of Jesus from the dead to bring salvation to mankind. There are two pictures I would like to paint of this dramatic event (compare John 20:1-10 and Matthew 28:1-10). One, the stone slowly began to move, just in case someone was out there, Jesus peeks out the crack and decides: "It's safe now". He then tiptoes out so as not to make a sound. The second is the one I prefer to picture. The stone moves with such a force that the guards are scared to death, almost literally, and Jesus steps out with a shout of: "GLORY". God's plan of salvation to those who choose to repent of their sins and receive God's forgiveness through the atoning work of Jesus on the Cross is complete, finished, done, once and for all!!

That *breaking forth* of Salvation still comes to us when we take a good look at ourselves and realize that we are, in fact, miserable sinners. The advertisements today encourage us to get everything "we deserve". We deserve a new car, we deserve a good job, we deserve good health. Why? What did we ever do to deserve anything? When I look deeply into myself, the only thing I deserve is punishment for my sins. I really do deserve that. But because of what Jesus has done I receive forgiveness. I don't deserve it. It is a gift from God that came as a Baby in a Manger with a Mission on a Cross.

Throughout the Bible the words *break forth* are found repeatedly. Isaiah 44:23: "Sing, O ye heavens; for the Lord hath done it: shout, ye lower parts of the earth: break forth into singing, ye mountains..." Isaiah 49:13 ""Sing, O heavens; and be joyful, O earth; and break forth into singing..." There are many people that walk around as if they just can't wait for this life to be over. A theme song from "Hee-Haw" always on their lips: "Gloom despair and agony on me, deep dark depression, excessive misery, if it weren't for bad luck I'd have no luck at all, gloom despair and agony on me."

Wherein is the answer? It is found in none other than Jesus Christ. When we open our hearts to Jesus and the Holy Spirit comes in, He brings joy. (Galatians 5:22). Listen to me Christian, joy is within you; sometimes we bury it deep under our trials and tribulations. The devil tries to suffocate our joy in despair. The answer is *break forth*. Just as spring *breaks forth* and we open the windows of our homes to the sunshine, we can open the doors of our hearts to God's sonshine. It is time to sing a new song. Psalm 96:1-2 tells us "O sing unto the Lord a new song; sing unto the Lord all the earth. Sing unto the Lord, bless His name; *show forth* His salvation from day to day".

Are you tired of singing the same old sad song? Then *break forth* into joy. No one can do it for you. The power to do so lies within you. It is a gift imparted by the Holy Spirit. Accept the gift. Be a tower of strength to your family and community and church. Don't think about it or wonder if the coast is clear. Don't be concerned if anyone can hear you. Go ahead, lift up your head, open your mouth and shout GLORY. You are probably thinking "I'd feel silly." Go ahead, do it, I double dog dare you! Rare back and shout GLORY! Break forth into joy! You won't find joy in a jar on a shelf or in a phone call, you will find it within you in the presence of God. GLORY!!!

FOR THE YOUNG AT HEART

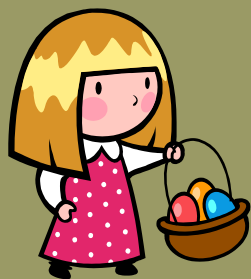


“*FUSION* is a campus movement dedicated to moving students closer to Christ. When we encounter God, He consumes us and we become more and more like Him.”

And I feel promise beneath my feet.*

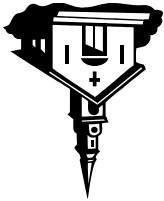

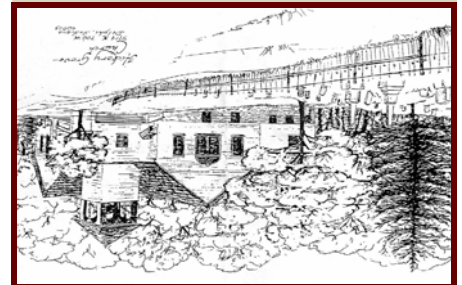
