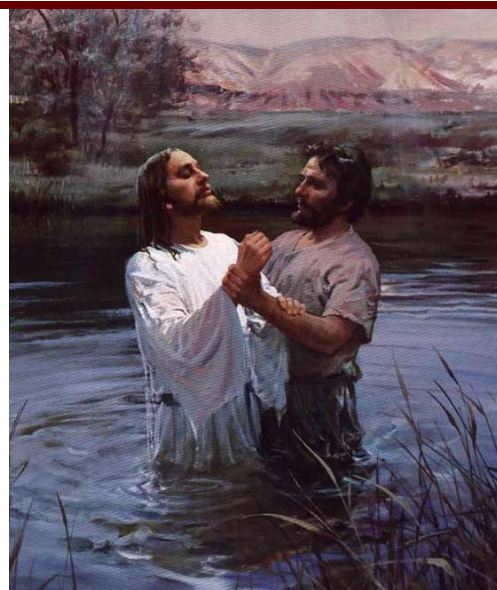

She added reflections on "Who Is My Neighbor?" and "Do I Show Jesus' Love in my Life's Path?" Arleen also gave a brief historical glimpse into the origins (287 A.D.) and development of Valentine's Day to date. Don Dill brought Helen Steiner Rice poems "It's Such a Busy World" and "Take Time to Be Kind" that fit well with the spirit of the day. A very moving piece, "Queen," written by Don's son Jerry, in respect and tribute to his late Mom, Della Dill, was shared as well. Before adjournment, Gary Reedy and Dieter Hantschel played off each other with a short skit of outrageous court room dialogs. PASTOR'S PEN

What Happens to the Offering Money?

Every Sunday morning the offering plates are passed down the rows. Did you ever wonder why it was taken or what happens to it? Malachi 3:10 instructs us to "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house." In other words, that the needs of God's house may be met. We set aside the tithe, the tenth of our income, to return to God and His work on Sunday morning. In the Old Testament a box was placed at the back of the temple and people dropped their tithes into the box on their way in. Today, as a matter of convenience, we "pass the plate". Some put in cash, others checks, at their discretion.

After the service, the treasurer picks up the plates, takes them into another room, and puts the money in a bank bag for safekeeping. She later counts the money and deposits it at the bank into our church account. If a special offering has been included, for instance building fund or missionaries, the treasurer makes sure it goes where it was designated. The rest goes into what is called a "general fund" on the treasurer's ledger. The treasurer keeps in confidence what was given by those who gave it. That information does not go to the Pastor or anyone else in the church. We are blessed to have a treasurer with the integrity to do this job so professionally.

Well then, what happens? At a business meeting, it was agreed the church should give back a tithe of the "general fund" to missions and outreach projects, both locally and abroad. Therefore 10% of the "general fund" goes into a "Missions and Outreach Fund". A committee meets quarterly to decide what to do with this 10% from the general fund. From this account, money is given to support numerous organizations. Some are Carroll and White County Food Pantries, Emmaus Missions, Real Hope for Haiti, McClain's in Costa Rica, and Carroll and White County Religious Education Programs. The Missions and Outreach fund also helps sponsor outreach events like Movie Night, Love and Respect Seminar, Angel Tree Gifts and Ice Cream Social Benefits.

What happens to the remaining 90%? Mostly the same thing that happens to your checking account: to pay expenses and bills. The Pastor and the Custodian are the only paid positions in the church; the remaining positions are filled with volunteer help. The Pastor's salary and health insurance and other expenses are paid through the "general fund". To give you some for instances, here are what some of the other expenses were in 2010. Property and liability insurance, \$5158; propane, \$3649; electricity, \$2111; telephone, \$983; trash removal, \$217; and Vacation Bible School, \$744. If you take into account cleaning supplies, plates, cups, napkins, coffee, copy paper, toner, staples, pencils, sweeper bags and so on and so on, last year these came to \$5577. That doesn't include many other categories such as special music, advertising, water softener rent, church website and mowing the yard. Capital improvements, like replacing the carpet and replacing the windows, (which happened in 2010) all come from the general fund. Copies of the financial report are made available to all at the quarterly business meeting. The treasurer compiles this report showing what came in and what went out during the past quarter. A special committee audits the treasurer's books annually.

How does it all work? God is faithful. As we are faithful to Him in our giving, He is faithful to us to make sure there is enough. As we grow, our offerings increase to meet our needs and expenses. Last year, through Missions and Outreach and designated special offerings, \$26,752 was given back to the community and missions projects to invest in the Kingdom the message that Jesus Christ is alive and still in the saving business. When we sit back and look at what all God has done with the finances through the church, we excitedly look forward to what all God might do as more and more of God's people are financially faithful to Him.

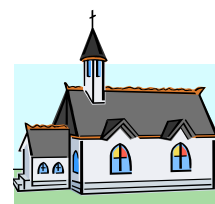
